




Capital Programs Update

IIJA Update

- We are in the second to last year of IIJA.
- 75% of the IIJA core formula program funding was for existing planned projects.
- Of the remaining 25% of core formula funding, only 13% went to existing program increases.
- The remaining 12% went to new programs from IIJA.



IIJA Update

- Minnesota has received a significant share of the funding from the multiple IIJA grant programs authorized by IIJA.
- The five larger IIJA grants included:
 - Blatnik Bridge (in conjunction with Wisconsin) \$1.08 B
 - I-494 EZ-Pass Lane \$138 M
 - Downtown Moorhead, Safety and Livability Rail Grade Separation - \$26 M
 - I-90 Bridge Replacement in Austin \$25 M
 - Hwy 210 Brainerd Equity, Safety, and Multimodal Connectivity Project - \$25 M



Federal Fund Obligation Rate

- Is the percentage of actual federal funding FHWA provides to MnDOT each year, compared to the total amount of contract authority provided by the current transportation authorization act (In this case, IIJA/BIL).
- 100% would represent every dollar authorized being provided to the states.
- Historically the obligation rate has been between 90-93%
- It has dropped into the mid-80% as we near the end of IIJA.

Reasons Behind Declining Obligation Rate

• Lower annual appropriation levels approved by Congress for the core programs than those authorized by IIJA.

 Slow start of spending national competitive grant programs and need to have that funding commitment available in future years of IIJA.

- Forecast is required to be flat based upon MnDOT's current biennial budget and base budget set in State law.
- When the 2025 Legislature passes the 2026-2027 biennium budget, the target levels will be adjusted to reflect the new budget for the 2027-2030 STIP.

Future – Readiness Advancement Projects

- In the winter of early 2024, MnDOT staff shared information about the new Local Screening Body responsibility for the Corridors of Commerce program.
- During that time and as part of the presentations, MnDOT, sought participation of from interested individuals to participate in an advisory group to develop Readiness Advancement project guidance.
- The advisory group met three times between February and May to develop overall program guidance, with a focus on identifying metrics for scoring readiness advancement projects in line with the eight criteria in statute.
- The guidance is pending review and approval of the Transportation Programming & Investment Committee (TP&IC).
- The Project Readiness solicitation will occur Winter 2024/2025.



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
